Kurus Elavia is the CEO of Gateway Security, Inc. After earning a business degree from India's Bombay University, Kurus moved to Newark and launched his career at Gateway in 1987.

Starting as a security guard, Kurus steadily increased his responsibilities until in 1999 he was appointed Gateway's chief operating officer by Louis Dell'Ermo, the company's founder and owner. As the first non-family member to be an executive, Kurus committed to double Gateway's revenues within two years—or else resign from the company. Two years later, Gateway's revenues had tripled.

Under Kurus' leadership and vision, Gateway has expanded its scope of services far beyond a security guard company, positioning itself as a trusted service advisor. Kurus' credo: "If we cannot do it for you, nobody can do it for you."

Kurus keeps a hand in all company decisions, ranging from the corporate logo to employee hires. Happy clients' word-of-mouth endorsements have expanded the company's reputation and that goodwill has lead to revenues exceeding \$60 million.
